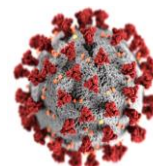

“High Speed Internet for All” Campaign We Need Your Help!

Background: Over 40% of residents in Eastern Ontario lack access to reliable high speed internet service.

COVID 19 has highlighted the frustrations of having unreliable internet service. Increased dependence on the internet for education, jobs, healthcare and connecting with family, has left many rural residents behind.

Broadband in Front of Yonge:

Front of Yonge is supporting the goal of the Eastern Ontario Regional Network (EORN) to bring reliable high speed internet to every home, business and institution.

A broadband workgroup has been formed in Front of Yonge. As an important first step the group is conducting a survey and ***NEEDS YOUR HELP!***

BROADBAND INTERNET SURVEY

Please help us pinpoint the strengths and weaknesses in our township's broadband internet by filling out a brief survey.

Steps: Select "Internet Service Survey" in the left-hand column. (Note: For final question titled “Speed Test” follow the link, then Press GO). 3 numbers will appear at the top: Ping, Download and Upload (may take a few seconds to load). Go back to survey question box and record the 3 numbers. Press SUBMIT.
