FIRE PREVENTION WEEK - October 9-15, 2016

"The theme of Fire Prevention Week this year is Don't Wait, Check the Date of your smoke alarms," says Fire Chief Greg Halladay. "Smoke alarms don't last forever. So we challenge everyone to take a selfie of their family checking the expiry date of their smoke alarms and post it on social media, to show everyone your alarm is up to date."

Smoke alarms wear out over time and need to be replaced within the time frame indicated by the manufacturer, usually 10 years. The date of manufacture is indicated on the back of the smoke alarm and the expiry date is taken from that date. While smoke alarms typically last 10 years, some have different expiry time frames. Check the manufacturer's instructions for the expiry time frame of your smoke alarms.

72-HOUR EMERGENCY KITS

It is always a good idea to have an emergency kit prepared at your home, at all times. Your kit should include, but not limited to, the following items: bottles of water, canned food, manual can opener, flashlight and batteries, extra batteries, first aid kit, special needs items (eg. medications, list of allergies, etc.), canes, walker, hearing aids, breathing apparatus, identification, cash, emergency contact list.
