ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIP

The Township Council has agreed to join the newly formed St. Lawrence Corridor Economic Development Commission with hopes to attract more industrial and commercial business to the region. The Commission is comprised of the Townships of Leeds and The Thousand Islands, Front of Yonge, Elizabethtown-Kitley, the City of Brockville, Augusta Township, the Town of Prescott and the Township of Edwardsburg/Cardinal. TAX RELIEF FOR SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABLILITIES

For those who qualify, a portion of property tax will be set aside with an agreement to repay the municipality when the person no longer qualifies or the property is sold. The first installment of the final 2017 tax bill is due June 27th. The second installment of the final 2017 tax bill is due September 27th. Reminder notices will <u>NOT</u> be sent out for the second installment. <u>Failure to receive a tax bill in the mail does not excuse the taxpayer from the responsibility of payment, nor does it relieve the liability of penalty for late payment. When using online or telephone banking, it's important to make payments at least 3 business days prior to the tax due date in order to meet payment deadlines.</u>
