Household Hazardous Waste Day events will be held as follows:



In an effort to raise awareness about the effects of garbage burning, Front of Yonge Council would like residents to be aware of the following:

Burning plastic, rubber or other man-made materials creates dioxin and other dangerous toxins in the air, soil & groundwater. This endangers you, your children, your neighbours, your pets, birds and fish — with tumours, cancer, learning disorders, infertility, immune system problems, asthma, and other diseases. Children, teenagers & pregnant women are at the highest risk. The resulting ash is also toxic and can easily get into the ground and into your well water. Dioxin and other chemicals are totally invisible, and their health effects are not immediate. It is easy to be unaware of the problems. But once you are aware, it doesn't make sense to continue. It may be hard to accept that the simple act of burning your garbage endangers you and your family but the longer you continue, the more poisons accumulate in your body.

Ideally, you shouldn't burn anything, other than for cooking food or heating your house. Burning leaves, plant clippings, paper, cardboard, and clean, unpainted, untreated wood is less hazardous than plastics – but is still not a healthy practice. **NOTE: A burn permit is required for all open burning including campfires and burn barrels.** 

Alternatives to burning garbage include disposing of man-made materials at the waste disposal site, composting leaves & garden waste, as well as re-using, reducing and recycling.
