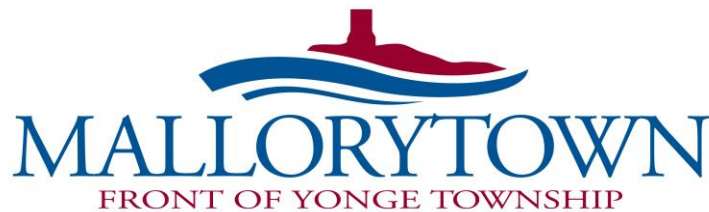

Until March 31st: \$12.50 for all spayed/neutered dogs

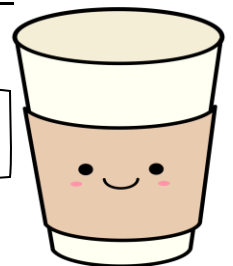
\$20 for all non-spayed/non-neutered dogs

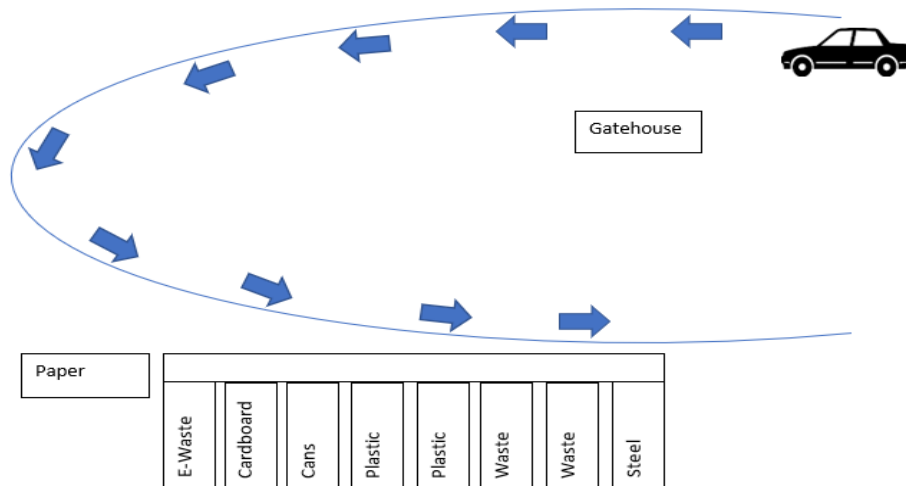

NEW WASTE SITE LAYOUT IS READY TO ACCEPT RESIDENT WASTE & RECYCLABLES!

Residents are asked to prepare by organizing their recyclables at home. The paper bin will be the first bin you come to as you enter the site, so your waste paper should be readily accessible. Please review the initial map of the new layout and organize your waste products accordingly. Your support will help in keeping a steady flow of traffic in and out of the site. As well, make sure you know the difference between cardboard and boxboard (cardboard is 3 layers, boxboard is 1 layer). Please remember to break cardboard down at home. Glass is not recyclable!



BROADBAND AWARENESS SURVEY RESULTS

Thanks to over 200 participants in the broadband survey, the Committee has been able to accurately map areas of strength and weakness by household and identify service providers.
