Until March 31st: \$12.50 for all spayed/neutered dogs \$20 for all non-spayed/non-neutered dogs


After March 31st, the license fee for tags will double






Reminder: Waste site staff are there to help you – just ask! If you require assistance, please respect social distancing and wear a mask.
