Voter information letters were mailed to all qualified electors early October. 72-HOUR EMERGENCY KITS

It is always a good idea to have an emergency kit prepared at your home, at all times. Your kit should include, but not be limited to, the following items: bottles of water, canned food, manual can opener, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, special needs items (eg. medications, list of allergies, etc.), canes, walker, hearing aids, breathing apparatus, identification, cash, emergency contact list, etc.



APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS/COMMITTEES!

The following Board/Committee appointments expire with the term of council. All current members of boards/committees are required to re-apply. Interested persons wishing to apply for a position to any of the following boards/committees for a term of four years, are asked to apply to the undersigned in writing by 4:00 pm on Wednesday, November 9, 2022.

Front of Yonge Public Library Board — Members manage the provision of library services to the community. Board meetings are 10 times per year (once a month, except in July and August).

Front of Yonge Recreation Committee – Members guide the development, operation and planning of recreational programs and events.

Front of Yonge Committee of Adjustment – Members consider applications under the Planning Act for minor variances to the zoning by-law, and enlargements of non-conforming uses.

Front of Yonge Mallory Coach House Heritage Committee – This is a committee of Council, with membership from the general public who guide the development and operation of the Mallory Coach House and planning of historical programs and events.

Front of Yonge Environmental Advisory Committee – This committee reviews policies, recycling/other environmental initiatives, and other tasks as required.

Front of Yonge Community Development Committee – Community Development is the process that influences the growth and well-being of a community. It deals with community development, business attraction and retention, access to healthcare, recreation and other important issues.

Yonge in Bloom Committee – This volunteer committee helps beautify the Village of Mallorytown and other spaces around the Township. Examples include, the seasonally decorated planters seen throughout the Village, the Mallory Coach House and Tony Kall Park, the Mallorytown gateway flower bed, Library/Community Centre flower beds, and more!
