Front of Yonge at a Glance

Township Office

The office is located at 1514 County Road 2 in Mallorytown, where you can stop in if you have any questions. Any form, policy, or by-law inquiries can be made here, as well as learning more about the community. The office can also direct you to the proper organization if your inquiry cannot be addressed municipally.

Website

The Township's website, **www.Mallorytown.ca**, is available 24/7 and offers additional information. This great resource provides a wide variety of information, including an Events Calendar of activities available within the area. A Business Directory list provides contact details for the local businesses and services in the area; and previous Community Newsletters and Meeting Minutes can be found online so you can see what has been happening in the community.

Postal and Newspaper Services

Canada Post has a location on Quabbin Road in Mallorytown (across the street from the Royal Canadian Legion) to assist you with sending and receiving mail. If you are part of a community mail box, the office or the Canada Post website will work on assigning you a box and key.

Monthly Newsletters

The Township Office distributes a monthly newsletter with important dates and information about projects, news, and events in the area. Copies are sent by mail to every residence in the township. Copies can be found in the Township Office, and they are also available electronically by signing up for our Mailing List, or by visiting the Newsletter section at www.Mallorytown.ca.

Newspapers

The Brockville Recorder & Times and Gananoque Reporter are available to subscribers.

Education

The Village of Mallorytown is home to Front of Yonge Elementary School. This public school is available for students from junior kindergarten to grade six and operates under the direction of the Upper Canada District School Board (UCDSB). Registration information can be found by contacting both Front of Yonge Elementary School and UCDSB. If you have a child that is in grade 7 or above, please contact the Upper Canada District School Board or the Catholic School Board of Eastern Ontario for information on enrollment in a local high school.

Local Groups

There are many social groups to help you meet other locals who share similar interests. Contacting the Township Office is a good place to begin as the staff may be able to direct you to a specific organization and provide contact information of a current member. Groups focused on active living, crafts, heritage, gardening, and more are available for adults to join. Programs for children are also offered in the region.

Renovations

When planning a renovation, consult the Building Permit Application Package available online and from the office to see if a Building Permit is required. Our Township has a lower median wait period from permit submission to approval than the provincial standard, typically being a business week faster. Permits are needed when renovations which exceed 10 square metres, and for pools, chimney or wood stove alterations/repairs, and decks. If you have any questions relating to your project, please contact the Township Office.



Recreation Park

The Mallorytown recreation Park is in the heart of Mallorytown and is located at 2A Park Lane off of Peryl Road and Miller Drive and offers space for a number of sport activities. There are multiple soccer fields and a baseball diamond. The Park also hosts a playground, ample parking, pickleball courts, an outdoor skating rink and a large roofed eating area with picnic benches. Soccer and baseball registration dates can be found on the Township website.

Pets

The Township has a Dog Control By-Law where a dog must be registered and licensed at the Township Office annually, and wear its assigned tag. The by-law states dogs brought into the Township are required to be licensed within fourteen days. Cats and other pets do not need to be registered but are required to follow the provincial and federal laws in place.

Waste and Recycling

Permanent and seasonal residents are required to purchase bag tags from the Township Office and use clear garbage bags in the Township's Waste Disposal Site which is located at 102 County Road 5. Recycling has extended past the typical plastics and metals, to now include most electronics and tires. Curbside collection is offered to residents in the Village of Mallorytown and is available through private contract throughout the Township. Hazardous waste, including pharmaceuticals, paints, and batteries, are accepted during designated times and locations, as a service by the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville at no charge. Information on annual Household Hazardous Waste Days can be found on the Township's website.

Waste Disposal Policies and Recycling Program

The waste disposal site is open to all residents of Front of Yonge Township. Only clear bags are accepted at the waste site (white kitchen-catchers inside of larger clear waste bags are permitted) with a bag tag on each bag. Waste Site Access Pass cards are required in order to gain access to the site. These cards were provided to all property owners in 2020. Any new property owner who was not left the card by the previous owner can order a new card at the Township Office. Replacement cards are \$25 each.

Large items, such as upholstered chairs, sofas, etc., may be disposed at the site, and require large item tickets. (See Fees)

Recycling can also be disposed of at the waste disposal site, including electronics and appliances (with CFC's removed).

Brush and leaves are accepted for free, to be disposed of in the location directed by the gatehouse attendant.

Recycling - What is Recyclable?

Mixed Paper Bin

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Flyers & inserts
- Catalogues
- Fine paper
- Paper egg cartons
- Box board (e.g. cereal & cracker boxes, paper towel rolls, etc.)
- Polycoated paper milk and juice cartons, tetra packs, juice boxes (with screw tops removed)

Corrugated Cardboard Bin

- Flattened corrugated cardboard
- Empty pizza boxes



Plastics Bin

- Plastics #1 #6 CONTAINERS MUST BE CLEAN! This includes plastic containers, plastic bottles, plastic tubs & jugs, clam shells, blister packs, salad boxes
- Grocery bags, retail plastic bags (place plastic bags inside one bag and tie-off)
- Milk bags (outer labelled bags, only NOT individual inner bags!)

Metal Containers Bin

- Aluminum and tin cans
- Aluminum pie plates
- Aluminum foil

Scrap Metal Bin

- All metals
- Metal coat hangers
- Non-refrigerated appliances (e.g. stove, washer, dryer)
- Empty/dry paint cans

Electrical & Electronics Bin

- Household electronics including computers & computer accessories, TVs & TV accessories, radios, telephones, cell phones
- Small household appliances including vacuums, toasters, kettles, microwaves & coffee makers

Battery Bin

- Household batteries of all sizes
- Car, boar and lawn tractor batteries

Propane Cylinders

- 20 lb tank no larger, leave valve in and CLOSED
- Single use cylinders (e.g. green BBQ or blue propane torch type)

Refrigerated Appliances

 Refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, water coolers (subject to a fee unless CFC's have been removed)

OPEN AIR BURNING

To provide for the control of open air burning within the Township of Front of Yonge



YOUR DEPARTMENT

The Front of Yonge Fire Department is located at 1491 County Rd. 2, Mallorytown and services the Front of Yonge Township. Established in 1957, the department acts as first responders to medical emergencies within the community, as well as addressing smoke and fire concerns. The FOY Fire Department participates in community events and fundraising efforts to promote the safety and well-being of the Township residents. On average, the departments 25 volunteers respond to an average of 125 calls per year.



ONLINE OPEN AIR BURNING PERMIT



Fire Safety Tips! **OPEN AIR BURNING**

ALWAYS CALL BEFORE YOU BURN

Our 24/7 open air burn hotline allows you to conveniently check the current burn status and indicate to us that you are planning to burn. Always use caution, regardless of the type of open air fire you are having.

MAINTAIN A CLEAR FIRE ZONE

Controlled, open air fires should not be within 15 m (49.5 ft) of any structure.

GARDEN HOSE

Keep 100 feet of garden hose with a spray nozzle, unwound and ready to use. Ensure it easily reaches your burn site.

PREPARE YOUR BURN AREA

Remove all vegetation and other material that could spread the fire.

STARTING YOUR FIRE

NEVER use flammable liquids, such as gasoline, to start your fire.

Pay attention to wind conditions and potential

In case of **EMERGENCY**

IMMEDIATELY CALL 9-1-1

An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department or an ambulance.

If you are unsure of whether the situation is an emergency, you should call 9-1-1.

Frequently ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO CAN OBTAIN A BURN PERMIT?

Only residents living in approved areas are entitled to apply for and obtain a burn permit. Issued permits are conditional and may be revoked at any time. If you are a tenant, permission from the property owner must be obtained.

IS THERE A FEE?

No. At this time, permits are free of charge.

HOW DO I OBTAIN A PERMIT?

Complete your Burn Permit application at FOY.BURNPERMITS.COM or visit the Township Office during regular business hours.
