Discussion took place regarding essential road projects that will move forward. Staff will confirm if the Pickleball project can proceed.

The Roads Department were thanked for the work that was done at the Caintown shed, and for pushing back brush at the waste site. A reminder will be placed in the next newsletter to ensure residents are aware that salvaging material at the waste site is prohibited.
