

Mallorytown and area – rural living at its best! Come and see for yourself.




For Recreation.... In addition to the municipal recreation park, we are home to the St. Lawrence Islands National Park at Mallorytown Landing. This national park is home to more than 20 island properties. It features a boat launch, picnic area, playground, nature centre and the newly developed Jones Creek Trail system. Just east of here, is the Brown's Bay Provincial Park, with a huge green space for picnics and family reunions, three beach areas, canteen, new playground equipment, beach volleyball court and a smaller boat launch area. Graham Lake is another popular recreation destination. Boating, kayaking, canoeing, fishing, swimming and hiking are among the many forms of outdoor recreation available. If camping appeals to you, there are six campgrounds in the area, including the Mallorytown KOA. Ivy Lea Provincial Park provides camping a few km west of here. All along the scenic 1000 Islands Parkway, is a paved path used for walking and cycling, extending 37 km from the eastern border of Front of Yonge to Gananoque.


For Food and Drinks.... Purcell's Freshmart/LCBO is a full-service grocery store with dairy, fresh meat and poultry, deli, produce, dry cleaning service and ATM machine. They also sell plants and gardening supplies in season. The KOA Campground store provides propane tank exchange, as well as camping necessities. The local restaurant has a large menu of popular items, and there is a Fudgery which sells candy and ice cream. There is also a small store at the Bridge Island Motel, located just across from the National Park at Mallorytown Landing.

For Those Wanting To Get Involved.... We have Community Service Clubs, artist organizations, the Royal Canadian Legion, and several committees including Communities in Bloom, Heritage, and Recreation. There are special events such as the 1000 Islands Art Tours, Winter Festival, Village Fair and Strawberry Social. Two churches are active in the Township as well.

For Other Services.... There are medical clinics a short distance away both in Athens and Lansdowne, as well as hospitals located in Brockville (20 minutes) and Kingston (45 minutes). The Township Library offers a wide range of the latest titles, as well as WiFi internet access. Upstairs, the spacious community hall is often used for exercise groups, art classes, local committees and private functions such as birthday parties. The recently restored Mallory Coach House and Heritage Gardens offer an inviting outdoor space for events, as well as historical displays and activities indoors. The Mallorytown Country Market will be open Sundays mid-July to mid-September for sale of produce, crafts, etc. Local businesses include a hair salon, B&B, two auto service shops, a Diving business and an ATV tours and trails business, just to name a few. The Fire Department, Township Office and Post Office are all located in the Village of Mallorytown.
