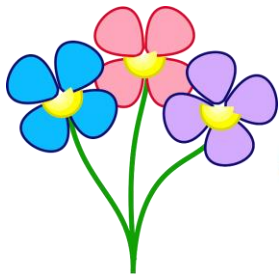

## MEDICAL CLINIC UPDATE

As everyone knows, the clinic at the Mallorytown Pharmacy closed January 20, 2023 as a result of funding cuts by the provincial government. Soon thereafter, the government announced that funding would be provided to open new nurse practitioner clinics across the province and MPP Steve Clark said that Mallorytown would be at the top of that list. Although this was certainly welcoming news, we are still waiting for word of that funding from the Ministry of Health. We are now heading into our third month without a medical clinic. Front of Yonge Council and the citizens working group will continue to pursue this project to restore a very important service that was taken from our community.

## PICKLEBALL COURTS NOW OPEN!

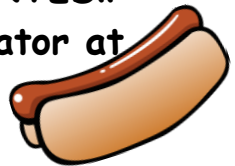
The pickleball court at the Recreation Park is ready for use! Racquets & balls can be borrowed from the library to try out the fastest growing sport in North America!
