EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

WHAT TO DO IN A FLOOD EMERGENCY:

During a flood, Emergency Preparedness Ontario suggests taking the following actions to minimize the damage to your property:

- Turn off basement furnaces
- Turn off outside gas valve
- Turn off electricity – if the area around the fuse box is wet, stand on a dry board and use a dry wooden stick to turn off the power
- NEVER cross a flooded area, whether on foot or in a vehicle; the fast moving water could sweep yourself and your vehicle away. Flooded waters can cause your vehicle to stall – if this happens, leave your vehicle and get yourself and your passengers to safety on foot.



72-HOUR EMERGENCY KITS

It is always a good idea to have an emergency kit prepared at your home, at all times. Your kit should include, but not be limited to, the following items: bottles of water, canned food, manual can opener, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, special needs items (eg. medications, list of allergies, etc.), canes, walker, hearing aids, breathing apparatus, identification, cash, emergency contact list, etc.
